Change to the 4th Class Power Engineer Examination Syllabus



Effective November 1, 2017

In October of 2014, Standardization of Power Engineer Examinations Committee (SOPEEC) announced changes to the 4th Class Power Engineer Syllabus in support of industry's request to realign the learning process of the syllabus topics.

Effective November 1, 2017, a new set of 4th class examinations will be administered to follow the new changes to the 4th Class Power Engineer Examination Syllabus.

Power Engineer Regulation amendments in 2015 allows for candidates to write all 4^{th} class examinations without completion of hours.

Candidates who have passed only 1 exam at the fourth class level following the current syllabus must successfully complete the remaining examination by November 1, 2020. Failure to complete the remaining examination by November 1, 2020 will result in the expiration of the completed examination.

New candidates and candidates who have not successfully passed any of the fourth class examinations by January 1, 2018 will be tested for competency based on the new Revised Fourth Class Power Engineer Examination Syllabus. Clients who have not successfully passed any of the fourth class examinations will be given the option of challenging the Revised Fourth Class Power Engineer Examination as early as November 1st, 2017 upon request.
