





- RCMP D Division advises the OFC of the situation (Who, What, Where & Why)
- OFC resources are mobilized
- CASARA resources are mobilized
- Three closest volunteer SAR teams to the incident are mobilized
- Scene assessment completed prior to further resource mobilization
