GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

PART I

REPORT FORMS: All fire departments are required to complete a fire report. The original copy is to be forwarded to the Office of the Fire Commissioner in Winnipeg within one week of the time the fire occurred.

The insurance adjuster is not required to complete a fire report form but rather a preliminary report with loss estimates, 7 days following the month in which the fire occurred. Upon completion of the claim, a second copy must be completed including details of the claim paid.

INCIDENT NUMBER: Is to be left blank and for the use of the Fire Commissioner's Office only.

INVESTIGATION FILES NUMBER: Is to be left blank and for the use of the Fire Commissioner's Office only.

PART II & III

BUILDING AND CAUSE CLASSIFICATION: All classifications under this item are described in detail in the Fire Report Manual, both by alphabetical indexes where possible and by code classification.

For detailed information on classifications, check the manual under the appropriate headings.

Complete the numerical coding using the detail provided in the manual.

DATE OF SIGNATURE: Indicate date report is submitted. Signature should be that of person submitting report. Include telephone number where reporting person may be reached.

FINAL CUT-OFF DATE FOR FIRE LOSS REPORTING: The cut-off date for reporting fire losses on a calendar year basis is **February 1st.** (MB.).

Reports of fires received after February 1st which occurred in the previous year, will be added to that year however the information may not be reflected onto the corresponding Annual Report.

DEFINITIONS

FIRE

Fire is an instance of destructive and uncontrolled burning, including scorch burns and explosions of combustible solids, liquids or gases. It does not include the following, *except where they cause fire* or occur as a consequence of fire:

- a. Explosions of steam boilers, hot water tanks or other pressure vessels due to internal pressure and not to internal combustion;
- b. Explosions of ammunition or other detonating material

The Fires Prevention and Emergency Response Act mandate that a local assistant must report:

- All uncontrolled fires involving a structure, vehicle, or outdoor property.
- All fire (controlled/uncontrolled) that violates bi-law regulations

A fire report will also be required for incidents that would result in a fire insurance claim.

EXPOSURE FIRE

An exposure fire is one which occurs as a direct consequence from another separate fire. There are two types of exposures:

Single owner/property exposure – occurs when the exposure is within the same property and structures/objects are owned by the same person. For example a detached garage fire that extends to the main house will only require one main report.

Multiple owner/property exposure – occurs when a fire extends from one property onto another or onto a structure/object belonging to a separate owner. In this case a main report is required along with separate exposure reports for the other structure/objects involved.

CHILD

A person that is apparently or actually under the age of 12

YOUTH

A person that is between the ages of 12-17

ADULT

A person that is between the ages of 18-54

SENIOR

A person that is the age of 55 or over

EXCERPTS FROM THE FIRES PREVENTION AND EMERGENCY RESPONSE ACT

LOCAL AUTHORITIES AND LOCAL ASSISTANTS

Local assistant must give immediate notice

- A local assistant must immediately notify
 - (a) the fire commissioner and the police if
 - (i) a person dies or is seriously injured because of a fire, or
 - (ii) the local assistant believes that a fire might be incendiary or is of suspicious origin; and
 - (b) the fire commissioner if
 - (i) an explosion causes injury to a person or damage to property,
 - (ii) the local assistant cannot determine the cause, origin or circumstances of a fire, or requires the assistance of the fire commissioner to conduct the fire investigation, or
 - (iii) in the opinion of the local assistant, a fire results in a significant loss to the local authority or its residents.

Local assistant to investigate fires and report

25(1) Unless otherwise directed by the fire commissioner, a local assistant who becomes aware of a fire within his or her local authority must investigate its cause, origin and circumstances and report to the fire commissioner.

Report in approved form to be made within 14 days

25(2) A report under subsection (1) must be in an approved form and must be filed with the fire commissioner within 14 days after the fire comes to the local assistant's attention.

Annual report re emergency response resources

26(1) A local authority must annually file a report with the fire commissioner containing information required by the fire commissioner about emergency response resources in the local authority.

Person responsible for ensuring report is filed

- 26(2) The following persons must ensure that the annual report is filed with the fire commissioner:
 - (a) in the case of a municipality, its chief administrative officer;
 - (b) in the case of a community incorporated under *The Northern Affairs Act*, its community administrative officer:
 - (c) in the case of an area in Northern Manitoba that is designated as a community under *The Northern Affairs Act*, the person designated by the minister responsible for the administration of that Act;
 - (d) in the case of a local government district, its resident administrator.

INSURERS AND ADJUSTERS

Definitions

29(1) In this section, "adjuster" and "licence" have the same meaning as in section 1 of *The Insurance Act*.

Immediate report

- 29(2) An insurer or adjuster who has information indicating that a fire is or might be incendiary or of suspicious origin must immediately
 - (a) report that information to the fire commissioner; and
 - (b) give the fire commissioner, on request,
 - (i) any information the insurer or adjuster has about the owner or occupant of the land or premises where the fire occurred, and the use or occupancy of that land or premises, and
 - (ii) any report or other information the insurer or adjuster may have, or may have obtained, about the cause, origin and circumstances of the fire.

Monthly report — insurer

29(3) Monthly, an insurer must report to the fire commissioner every fire occurring in the province in which it is interested as insurer.

Monthly report — adjuster

29(4) Monthly, an adjuster engaged in making adjustments of loss or damage by fire must report to the fire commissioner every adjustment he or she made respecting a fire occurring in the province.

Content and filing of report

- 29(5) A monthly report required under this section must
 - (a) be in the approved form;
 - (b) contain the information specified by the fire commissioner; and
 - (c) be filed with the fire commissioner's office within 10 days after the end of the month to which it relates.

Information in addition to other reports

29(6) Information and reports provided under this section are in addition to any other information or report that the insurer or adjuster is required to make by this Act or another enactment.

INCIDENT INFORMATION

REPORTING AGENCY FILE NUMBER

Fire Department file number or the insurance policy number

DATE AND TIME OF INCIDENT

Date and time of incident refers to the year, month, date, day of the week, and hour of the day, and should be coded as indicated in subsections below.

If the date and time of incident is unknown, code either as 9 or 90, whichever is applicable.

Year: 1990 Use four digits of the year.

Date of Month: 01-31 Use date.

90 Date of month unknown.

Day of Week: 1-7 Use Sunday as 1

9 Day of week unknown

Statutory Holiday Indicate Yes or No

Time of Day: 00-23 Use the exact hour based on the 24 hour clock.

90 Hour of day unknown.

INCIDENT LOCATION

Data regarding the location of the incident shall be recorded as required by the authority having jurisdiction. Use street addresses where possible for cities, towns and villages. When adding the terms "In Front Of" or "In Rear Of", terms must be placed AFTER the street name unless a separate field specifically for this info is available. Lots, block and plan numbers are helpful if street address is not available. In rural areas list section, township and range where fire occurred.

In all cases indicate municipality where fire occurred. Postal addresses may be different and do not necessarily indicate the municipality where the fire took place. As an example - RM of West St. Paul describes the location of the fire as opposed to RR No. 1 Winnipeg. Also a person's postal address might be Stony Mountain but his property could well be located outside the village limits in RM of Rockwood.

OCCUPANT

Enter occupant's surname and given names. Enter "same address" if occupant lives at the location of fire. If the occupant owns the business enter home address.

Use this heading to record insured persons losses even though they are not personally involved. For example, a claim may be made for losses sustained to personal property lost in a fire involving premises that are not occupied by insured. This might be a fur coat stored in a fur vault or a camera claimed for if destroyed in a fire while in a repair shop.

Identify a business by name. For example, "Major Pratt Collegiate", "Victoria Inn" "Family Food Fare", etc.

If a vehicle, boat or aircraft fire, enter the name(s) and home address(es) of the operator and all occupants. When a grass or rubbish fire enter the name(s) and address(es) of the person(s) who occupy the property on which the fire occurs.

Indicate in the box provided whether or not the property lost by occupant was insured.

OWNER

Enter owner's surname, given name and address.

The owners name is very important as this is the best method of relating various reports that involve one fire incident.

Indicate in the box provided whether or not the property lost by owner is insured.

INSURANCE PARTICULARS

Complete all loss figures to the closest dollar. If figures are not available, estimates are to be provided, to be replaced with final figures when available. Do not use terms such as "actual cash value" to describe insured value, if figure is not available, use estimated figures.

Vehicle fires should be classified as 'Miscellaneous', unless inside a structure. In this case the vehicle would be classified as 'Contents' within a structure.

Do not include as a "fire loss" insurance paid for "business interruption", "rents" or similar payments.

PROPERTY VALUE

Enter the value estimate for the building and contents. Only include values for structures/objects that were affected by the fire. Any vehicles/items found within a structure WILL BE VALUED AS CONTENTS within that structure.

ESTIMATE OF LOSS

Loss shall be recorded as the damage caused by the fire. The loss includes damage to property and contents. Such loss shall not exceed the cost of repair and replacement on a like kind and quality basis.

Loss shall only include direct loss caused by fire, including salvage, but not indirect loss due to "use and occupancy" or "business interruption".

CLAIM PAID

Fire Departments do not complete this box.

Enter the name of the claims adjuster, the firm he is employed and the name of the insurance company which holds the policy and policy number.

POLICE INVOLVEMENT

Also indicate if police authorities were involved, type of force and station location.

PROPERTY DESCRIPTION & FIRE PROTECTION FEATURES

Part II contains sections which are intended to be used together to describe where fires occur.

A restaurant fire in a hotel or a clothing store fire in a shopping plaza are examples which reflect the need to capture two elements of information. If only hotel information is collected, the restaurant data will be lost. Similarly, if only shopping plaza data is collected then clothing store information is lost. The use of two code sections will allow the user to capture both hotel and restaurants in the first example and clothing store and shopping plaza in the second example.

Property Complex refers to the hotel and the shopping plaza in the above examples while Property Classification refers to the restaurant and the department (clothing) store.

PROPERTY COMPLEX

Major Occupancy refers to the overriding (major) use of a building, area etc., under single management having two or more uses. To verify property complex identify what type of land the fire occurred on. (ie: residential land (31), farm land (92), FN reserve (82), etc)

NOTES:

- a) If the building, structure or facility has two or more major uses, none of which is overriding, code under 93.
- b) If the property involved is other than a building structure or facility (eg., vehicle, outside area, classify under 90. EXCEPT where a vehicle or outside area is part of a property complex such as a school yard, farm or first nations property etc., please code accordingly. (eg., garbage container on school property classify under 13, grass or vehicle fire on farm classify under 92).
- c) First Nation code 82 is only applicable to rural reserves. Urban reserves will continue to be coded as the type of area (residential, school, etc.) unless advised otherwise by the Province.

PROPERTY CLASSIFICATION

The term "property" under this classification denotes the type of use made of the area within a building, structure or other facility where the fire occurred. If two or more properties with different owners are involved in a fire, two reports will be required. The property classification on the main report will reflect where the fire originated. On the exposure report the property classification will indicate the second item affected. Any item found within a structure (including vehicles) will be considered as contents; therefore only one report is required whether or not different owners are involved.

If an exposure fire involves structures or items associated to one owner and one address, only one report is required. In this case the property classification would reflect the item that would have the potential for greater loss whether or not it sustained the most fire damage.

The tabulation of the fire loss data using Property Classification will reveal the risk factors associated with the different types of properties.

Simply, property classification will indicate what are you reporting was on fire. Was it solely a garage or was it a house from a garage?

NUMERIC CODES

Property for the gathering of persons for civic, political, travel, religious, social education or recreational purposes. Such property is characterized by the presence or potential presence of crowds, with attendant panic hazard.

300 RESIDENTIAL

Property in which sleeping accommodation is provided for normal residential purposes. Includes all buildings designed to provide sleeping accommodation except those classified under institutional. Subdivisions in this category are divided according to life hazard potential. Names and legal definitions may be different from those given here, but the categories have a significant difference from a fire and life protection standpoint. PROPERTY TYPE

Property Type refers to the type of property involved in the fire, i.e. building, vehicle, outside area, and should be coded according to one of the classifications listed below.

If the Property Type is unknown or not applicable, code under 0. If the Property Type is known but the description is not contained in the classifications listed below, code under 9.

- Building with one specific property use, eg., residential (includes apartment building with no business).
- 2 Building with two or more specific property uses, eg., shopping mall with restaurant, retail outlets, etc.
- 3 Vehicle
- 4 Open structure, includes a roof with no walls, open steel framing, bridge, trestle.
- 5 Tent, air supported structure.
- 6 Outdoor area
- 7 Underground structure, mine
- 8 Pier, wharf, open platform
- 9 Property Type unclassified
- 0 Unknown

GENERAL CONSTRUCTION

General construction describes the type of construction used in the floor-ceiling assemblies (excluding walls) of the building or structure, and should be coded in accordance with one of the following classifications.

NOTES:

- a) Heavy timber construction consists of floor-ceiling assemblies which are constructed of wood where the thickness of structural members of the thickness of floor and ceiling are not less than 3 inches.
- b) If more than one type of construction is involved, code under that type of construction which constitutes the major portion.
- c) If general construction is not applicable as in the case of a vehicle, or outside area, code under 8.

- 2 Protected Combustible Construction wood protected by plaster

ACT OR OMISSION

It is not only the Igniting Object, the Fuel or Energy in conjunction with it, or the Fuel, or Energy Causing Ignition, which result in a fire; there is also a set of circumstances precipitated by human acts (something is done) or human omissions to act (something which has not been done).

The purpose of this classification is to indicate these acts or omissions, be they deliberate or negligent. It includes such actions as incendiary acts and negligent use of fuel sources, equipment or materials. It also includes such factors as mechanical failures which may have resulted from human omissions through lack of maintenance, or through design, construction or installation deficiencies.

"Young offender" refers to the term as defined by the Young Offenders Act of the Canadian Criminal Code.

FUEL OR ENERGY

Fuel or Energy denotes the fuel or energy normally used in conjunction with the igniting object, and should be coded according to one of the classifications listed below.

NOTES:

- a) If lighting is involved, code under 7, whether or not an igniting object is also involved.
- b) In the case of an exposure fire, code under 8.

EXAMPLE:

If a fire results from gasoline being used to accelerate a coal fired stove, the fuel or energy used in conjunction with the stove (igniting object) is the coal and should be classified under 1.

MATERIAL FIRST IGNITED

Material First Ignited is the actual material ignited which brings about the fire condition. It does not include the fuel or energy associated with the Igniting Object, except where the Ignition of the fuel itself creates the fire condition. On an exposure report, the material first ignited will be base on the original fire.

Extent of Fire is the actual extent of burning or charring and does not include browning or blistering of paint. It should be coded according to one of the classifications listed below.

If the property involved is other than a building (example: vehicle, outside area), code under 8. Reports involving exposures will be coded as either 6 (structure) or 9 (outdoor property/vehicle).

TOTAL DEATHS

Fire Death - A person killed as a direct result of a fire or a person who dies from a fire injury within one year following the date on which the injury was sustained.

NOTE:

A person who dies from a medical condition or blunt force trauma as a result of a motor vehicle collision resulting in fire is NOT considered a fire death.

A person who is known to have committed suicide by burning or asphyxia IS considered a fire death. For these cases, Act or Omission shall be coded as 19 Incendiary – Unclassified/Unknown.

TOTAL INJURIES

Indicate the total number of men, women and children injured as a result of the fire. Total injuries refers to civilians and fire fighters.

Fire Injury - A person accidentally injured as a direct result of a fire.

MOTOR VEHICLE, BOAT, AIRCRAFT

For non-building fires, indicate what the fire was by entering in the area, ie., motor vehicle, boat, etc. Provide the details listed.

NUMBER OF PERSONS EVACUATED

REMARKS

Provide a brief but accurate description of the fire particulars. MUTUAL AID CODE

assigned consecutively from 001 for all casualties relating to a fire incident, e.g. if there are three people injured, there would be three Fire Casualty Reports initiated with the casualty numbers 001, 002 and 003

assigned respectively.

DATE OF FIRE/
